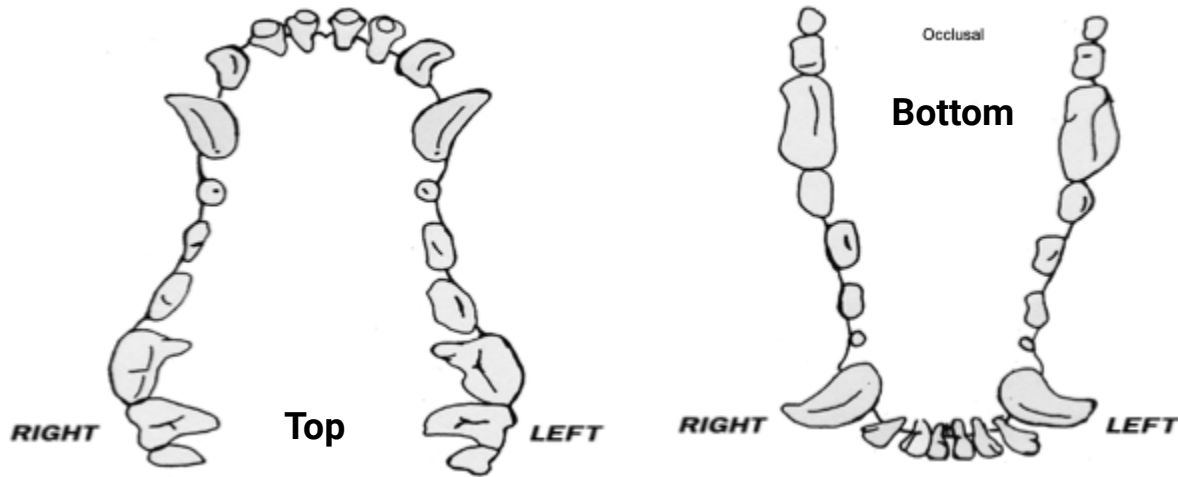


RSR Canine Post Surgical Information After Dental Procedure

From Your Foster Pet:

I was given an anesthetic which is why I am a little sleepy. I also have had an analgesic (pain) medication, which will help me as I recover! Allow me to recuperate in a quiet room away from other pets.

These were the teeth I had: removed or were missing



The RSR Veterinary Team has told me I have to follow these rules when I get home:

1. **Gradually introduce water to your foster pet.** As a note, your foster may not be interested in eating/drinking the day of surgery - this is normal. However:
 - If your foster vomits after eating, withhold food and contact your Foster Manager.
 - If your foster does not eat/drink the day after surgery, inform your Foster Manager.
2. **I will need softened dry food or canned wet food for 14 days.**
3. **No toys, bones, or hard treats for 14 days.**
4. **I may be sent home with a cone so I don't paw at my mouth and pull out the sutures.**
5. **I need to take the following medications listed below, as directed on the label:**

Carprofen tablets OR Meloxicam liquid
